



## Letter: Don Stevens to Francis Brabazon January 27 1973

Dear Francis:

Thank you for the Christmas card with the good news that John Berman had followed his good sense to ask you for a visit. I have some reasons that he will stay in Helsinki, and on the other hand I hope you will go in London for Kim's 10th birthday (how to spell it, and what name, what it means, etc.).

As you see from the stamps I'm now living in Spain and am scheduled to be here at least a year, or down to the Spanish government or people. I seem to have arrived at my impatience years ago. I seem to be a transfer. Or at least I've arrived at my peace from, instead of patiently putting up with it, I seem to have started to experiment with doing something about the situation with which I became impatient. First it was deciding I was fed up with the increasing impossibility of Anni's side's actions and the increasing impossibility of getting her to change on her own. When I got impatient with a personal situation that had refused to change for years I had put some dynamite under it and now the matter exploded with a new line of argument in standard that after three years of it what I decided I would take in was I wonder where this new line of attack will take me, to Russia.
